Thursday, Jan. 8, 6:00 pm

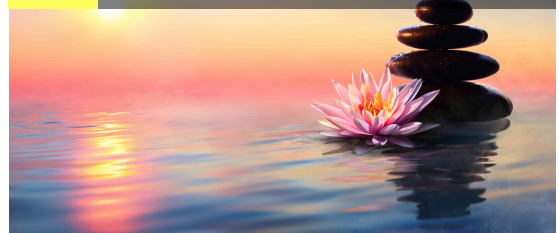

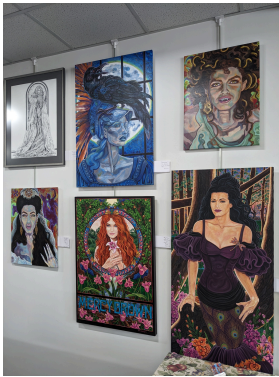
Rebecca Reddy | Main Gallery
